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## NOTE FROM YOUR BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Summer is here! On behalf of the Board of Trustees I would like to extend heartfelt greetings to all the residents of Incline Village and Crystal Bay and take a moment to thank everyone for their continued patience and understanding shown throughout these last three months in dealing with the COVID-19 crisis. These have been trying times, to say the least, but our community has stepped up to the challenges presented and we have proven to be a resilient, caring and empathetic group of residents once again. Thank you!

As we begin our summer season our District is faced with many challenges unforeseen in years past. Our Interim General Manager, Indra Winqest, and his senior staff, along with our dedicated employees make for a tremendous team of committed folks who are ready and able to operate our facilities in a seamless, albeit altered, manner for our home owners, residents and guests.

In my 35 years living in Incline Village and Crystal Bay I've never experienced anything quite like these last three months! Businesses closing overnight, houses of worship shuttered and residents being asked to shelter on site... clearly drastic measures to deal with an insidious, unseen foe. Yet, I've also seen an incredible adaptability of our private sector to come up with new and unique ways to tackle the issues at hand. I'm hopeful and encouraged that many of our restaurants, service businesses and civic organizations will be able to come back from the brink and flourish once again as our general economy rebounds.

We are a hardy lot up here in the mountains and I look forward to a season filled with our home owners, residents and guests recreating at our beautiful beaches, our well-manicured parks and ballfields, our soon to be opened Rec. Center and all of our facilities that make living here so incredible! Also, changes at

Tennis and Bocce will be welcome additions to our recreation roster.

We also have much-needed changes taking place within our financial realm. Internal controls and reporting are being revamped. Our Audit Committee has been completely reworked to give greater guidance and oversight to the financial processes to ensure complete transparency. The District is transitioning back to Enterprise Fund accounting within our Community Services arena. And our new Chief Financial Officer, Paul Navazio, has been meeting with financial experts within our community to address longstanding issues of concern which he is committed to rectify. The District has also engaged a new legal firm BB&K which will be handling all legal activities once the transition has transpired.

And we are bringing on board independent oversight of the entire Effluent Pipeline Project which begins at the Sweetwater plant and terminates at the wetlands in Carson City. This critical infrastructure project will be refocused to grapple with the many complexities inherent in such a herculean project and ensure a timely and successful completion.

Jeff and his team have been able to work on the course, and with the fast melting snows in April, the course opened May 18 in great shape for the 2020 season.

You may have even seen a few PGA Professionals and our District Merchandiser on the courses during the spring, picking up pinecones, mowing fairways, and filling areas with sand and seed for quick healing.

We have a strong team of PGA Professionals and managers that will continue to provide the best possible experiences here at the Championship Course. We have installed our brand new Range Hitting System on the driving range - instead of individual mats, this new setup is large pieces of synthetic

turf which looks like one large strip of grass and allows us to rotate the hitting stations throughout the season. (It's also easy to use a tee with the new surface.) I have tested the turf and it feels great! We look forward to our residents utilizing our new driving range setup.

I expect the play at The Championship Course and the driving range to be as busy (if not busier) than usual with everyone coming out of lockdown. With expected limitations and restrictions, please make sure you are connected through our email communications for further updates regarding the Golf Courses. As we get more information, we will make sure our residents are as up to date as we are.



As we all know, the coronavirus pandemic has changed our everyday lives and will change the Incline Village summer golf instruction programs to ensure we all remain safe.

We are excited to say that the Incline Village Golf Academy will be operational this year, but we will be implementing new safety procedures to ensure proper social distancing. We will not be conducting any group lessons to start, which affects the popular Get Golf Ready programs, as well as the Ladies clinics we run for the clubs. It will also affect our junior programs this summer.

However, I will be teaching one-on-one lessons in the private teaching area as I have been doing since 2009. This is a great way to work on your game in a safe environment. On-course playing lessons in the evening are also a great way to work on your game safely, as we will individually have our own carts and will be playing while the golf course is least crowded.



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## GOLF TIP

Golf is a lot like sprinting. This may sound strange to some, but if you think about it the golf swing is a very explosive action starting from a very

static position. This causes a lot of force through your body in a very short amount of time.

If you were to go for a sprint, it would be important to warm up your body beforehand, both so you don't pull a hamstring, but also so that you can perform at your peak.


And the same is true for golf. Whether it be for your next club championship, or a casual round with friends, being ready to play will not only shave a few strokes off your score, but will also help make it more enjoyable. With a proper warm-up routine, you can increase performance, prevent injury and continue playing golf to a much older age than you otherwise would.

Hitting golf balls before you play is important, but a proper warm-up should go beyond the range. Focusing

on balance, mobility and strength before you take your first swing are keys to success. Using a dynamic workout (i.e. moving the body through lunges, shoulder mobility exercises, etc.) versus a static warm up (holding stretches for a prolonged period of time) will get your blood flowing and your muscles ready to play.

Simple little moves can also be beneficial when you don't have a chance to hit the range. I've put together a short YouTube video to demonstrate a few of the warm up exercises you can try before you hit the first tee or even in your living room: [bit.ly/ivgolfwarmup](https://bit.ly/ivgolfwarmup).

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## GOLF MAINTENANCE UPDATES

Welcome to the 2020 golf season! We are excited to get the season started and to provide our golfers a quality product for their golfing experience.

There was a lot of work done before the golf courses opened in the spring. Some examples include extensive cleanup and snow removal, firing up and testing irrigation systems, implementing cultural practices such as aeration, seeding, topdressing and fertilization to activate growth where necessary, and getting the courses into good early season condition to withstand the heavy play throughout our short growing season. We have been very short staffed this spring due to the COVID-19 restrictions, but with a lot of hard work from the full-time maintenance staff and some help from the golf professional staff, we are in good early season condition.

The fall of 2019 and spring of 2020 were focused on projects that improved the player experience as well as the infrastructure of the golf courses. Listed below are some of the projects completed or in progress since September 2019:

### Championship Course:

- Bunker drainage and sand replacement on holes 10, 11, 12, and 13
- Built new red tees on holes 1, 5, 6, and 10
- Installed some split rail fencing to reroute traffic and enhance aesthetics
- Free span bridge installed on #14 to replace the old failing culverts
- Numerous irrigation improvements
- Extensive tree removal

### Mountain Course:

- Rebuilt the bunker complex around #4 green

- Rebuilt bunkers on #13 fairway and green
- Rebuilt and enlarged the back tee on #3
- Practice green area enhancements, including new irrigation and sod, and installation of a collar around the green
- Extensive tree removal

The bunkers with new sand will play soft for a while until the sand gets compacted. These improvements on both courses will be marked as Ground Under Repair as needed until ready for play.

The majority of this work has been accomplished in-house with our excellent staff. I would like to recognize Championship Course Assistant Superintendent George Fitch, Mountain Course Assistant Superintendent Jose Luis Torres, and Maintenance Foreman Martin Olivares in particular for their outstanding work and relentless efforts throughout the winter and spring battling Mother Nature to help get the courses into good playable condition.

We look forward to seeing you on the golf courses soon!

**PLAYING TENNIS SAFELY**  
Player Tips & Recommendations

**Preparing To Play**

- Wash your hands with a disinfectant soap and water for 20 seconds or longer, or use a hand sanitizer if soap and water are not readily available, before going to the court.
- Clean and wipe down your equipment, including rackets and water bottles. Do not share rackets or any other equipment such as wristbands, grips, hats and towels.
- Bring a full water bottle to avoid touching a tap or water fountain handle.
- Use new balls and a new grip, if possible.
- Consider taking extra precautions such as wearing gloves.
- Arrive as close as possible to when you need to be there.
- Avoid touching court gates, fences, benches, etc. if you can.

**When Playing**

- Try to stay at least six feet apart from other players.
- Consider not playing doubles, which could lead to incidental contact and unwanted proximity.

- Avoid touching your face after handling a ball, racket or other equipment. Wash your hands promptly if you have touched your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Avoid sharing food, drinks or towels
- Use your racket/foot to pick up balls and hit them to your opponent.
- Stay on your side of the court.
- If a ball from another court comes to you, send it back with a kick or with your racket.

**After Playing**

- Leave the court as soon as reasonably possible.
- Wash your hands thoroughly or use a hand sanitizer after coming off the court.
- Do not use the locker room or changing area.
- No extra-curricular or social activity should take place. No congregation after playing.
- All players should leave the facility immediately after play.

### **Pickleball Returns With Restrictions By Beverly Keil**

Last fall we stowed the outdoor pickleball nets after a very successful summer with people dinking, slamming and laughing on up to eight courts at a time, seven days a week during drop-in play. Over 60 new players took introductory lessons, competitive and advanced players participated in round robin tournaments, and extra tables were needed at biweekly BBQ social events. What a season!

Come summer 2020, our world has changed.

Pickleball has returned, though you will see some changes to comply with reality and social distancing guidelines. We cannot give you a drop-in play schedule at this time since drop-in encourages mixing, not distancing. However, the courts are open for personal play and practice drills. Arrange to meet a friend and get back into the game.

### **Playing Tip:**

This scenario is textbook pickleball—the way the top players do it:

1. The server executes a deep serve, then stays back with his partner waiting for the return of serve.
2. The receiver hits a deep return after the serve bounces.
3. A player on the serving team waits for the bounce, then hits the next shot soft and short to land in the opponent's kitchen. That's called the 3rd shot drop.

4. All players move to the kitchen lines and engage in a dinking rally, adding angles, trying to pull an opponent wide. Players patiently keep the ball traveling low over the net until one player makes the mistake of hitting a ball too high. You seize the moment and slam it at his feet or behind her. Good for you.

What's wrong with textbook play? It doesn't consider the real world where someone always goes off script! That's what makes pickleball so much fun. You have a short time to react and anything can happen. You learn to expect the unexpected.


# LOOK UP REMOTE WELLNESS

As the world adjusts to the ongoing reality of social distancing and gradual reopening of important public spaces and community events, the staff at the Incline Village Recreation Center have put together a new series of “Look Up” remote wellness and recreation programming designed to foster healthy lifestyles and community connections during the COVID-19 crisis.

The free online content series offers fitness classes, nutrition lectures, personal training tips, children’s programs, golf tips and community messaging for Recreation Center members, local residents and the extended Incline Village/Crystal Bay community.

“Our goal with the Look Up programming is to promote a holistic approach to wellness during these unprecedented times,” said Shelia Leijon, Fitness, Health and Wellness Manager at the Incline Village Recreation Center.

“The Rec Center has long been referred to as the heart of our community because of all the great community classes and programming we provide; so we felt a real urgency to maintain that role, even if we have to switch to an online model for delivering our programming.”



The Look Up remote wellness and recreation programming includes a library of prerecorded videos that community members can view at their leisure, as well as a schedule of live-streamed programming where participants can interact with the presenters.

If an IVGID Picture Pass or Recreation Punch Card has expired, property owners or authorized agents must complete the appropriate forms with the Parks & Recreation Department Counter during operating hours.

Guests must present one of the following to enter the beaches:

- A valid beach access IVGID Picture Pass
- A valid Recreation Punch Card with beach access

## CURRENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

### Incline Village Bocce Courts

At the August 14, 2019 Board of Trustees meeting, the Board prioritized construction of bocce courts. At the November 13, 2019 Board of Trustees meeting, a preferred site was selected adjacent to the IVGID Recreation Center. Engineering staff has completed design and the project has been awarded to Rapid Construction, Inc. Construction is scheduled to start the week of June 1.

### Mountain Golf Course Clubhouse Renovation

On August 11, 2018 a fire occurred in

the Mountain Golf Course Clubhouse which led to the closing of the kitchen area. The Board-approved renovation plans include a revised allocation of floor space, changes to access and substantial changes to customer flow, including new ADA accessibility to the lower level for food service, construction of a new and expanded outdoor deck area, and the installation of new windows and doors. The Board awarded the construction contract on August 14, 2019. Work is now complete and we invite the community to come see the new Clubhouse.

### IVGID Recreation Center Paver Entrance

A 2020 Capital Improvement Project to replace the cracking concrete entrance at the IVGID Recreation Center with concrete pavers. Engineering staff completed the design and bid the project. With the Recreation Center shut down due to COVID-19

restrictions, this work was able to be completed during the shutdown, minimizing disruption to operations once the Recreation Center reopens.

### WRRF Aeration System Improvements

The aeration process of wastewater treatment supplies oxygen to facilitate

the biological activity that converts raw sewage into treated wastewater effluent. This project funds the design and replacement of the aeration system equipment at the WRRF. The contractor mobilized to the site in late April and the project will continue until December 2020. IVGID has been put

on notice that there may be COVID-19 delays, but so far the contractor and their material suppliers are continuing to work, since they are considered essential businesses.

### Water Reservoir Safety and Security Improvements Phase 1

This project will replace the ladders that access the top of the water reservoirs, install intermediate access platforms, install protective railings and install new fall protection devices to meet the current Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) safety standards. The Board awarded the contract to Resource Development Company on April 10, 2019 for 10 of 13 reservoirs. Construction begins this summer and is expected to be substantially complete by September 15, 2020.

### Water Reservoir Safety and Security Improvements Phase 2

The second phase of this project would replace the ladders that access the top of the water reservoirs, install intermediate access platforms, install protective railings and install new fall protection devices for the remaining 3

reservoirs. Bid results are under review and are tentatively scheduled to be presented to the Board on June 10. If awarded, construction is scheduled to begin this summer and is expected to be substantially complete by October 15, 2020.

### Water Pump Station 2-1 (WPS 2-1)

This pump station distributes the disinfected potable water into the water distribution system to serve Incline Village and Crystal Bay. The motor controls and switchgear do not meet modern OSHA requirements for Arc Flash safety, are at the end of their service life, and no longer supported by the manufacturers. The Board awarded the contract in August 2019. Work is substantially complete and a Notice of Completion has been recorded.

### IVGID Recreation Center Site Lighting Replacement

A 2020 Capital Improvement Project to replace bollard and site lights with modern LED fixtures. An outside electrical engineering firm has completed design and the project has been awarded to Intermountain Electric, Inc. Construction began the first week of June.

Sara was appointed to the IVGID Board in January 2020 by the Washoe County Commissioners to serve through 2020.

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
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## DISC GOLF COURSE

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
